<p><i>I joined the Albion, male-convict ship, on the 9th May 1828, and, never having before seen the dispositions of a prison-ship, I examined those of the Albion with much interest. They seemed to be judicious and proved that considerable attention had been bestowed in perfecting this melancholy service.</i></p> <p><i>On the following day (10th May) the Guard came on board. It consisted of a Lieutenant, Sergeant, Corporal, 20 Privates, 5 Women and 8 Children.</i></p>
