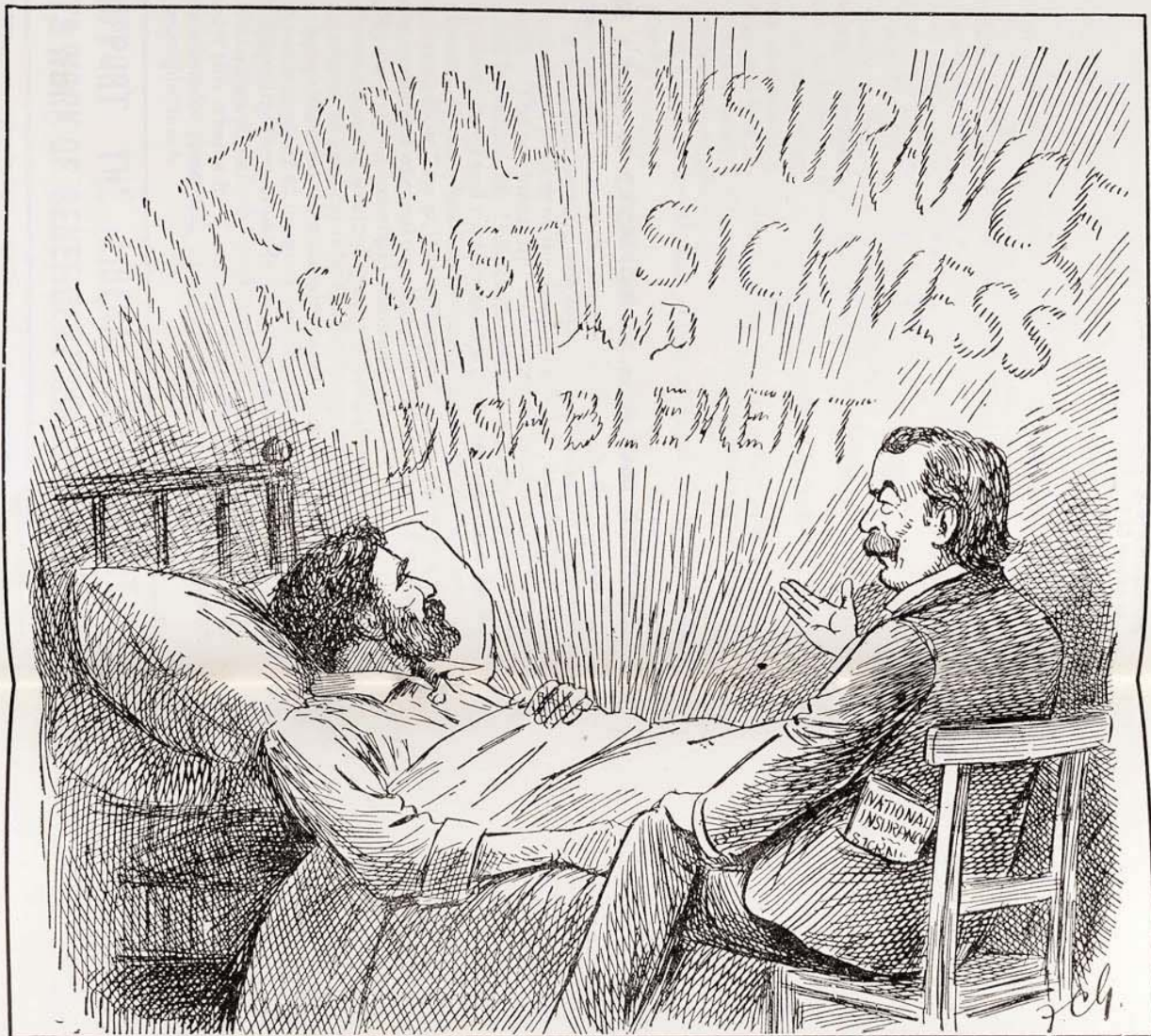
HOW TO USE THIS SOURCE TO HELP YOU ANSWER THE BIG QUESTION :
