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## **Introduction**

The deeds catalogued in this volume relate mainly to College lands in Buckinghamshire but include a few relating to Windsor and Winkfield, co. Berks., and Stanwell, co. Middlesex. There are two also concerning Burnham Sutton, co. Norfolk, (64 and 73), which appear in the exhibition cases (as nos. 21 and 22) where they were wrongly ascribed to Burnham, co. Bucks. It is not clear why these documents are at Eton, though the contiguity of Burnham Sutton and Docking may conceivably account for their presence. Another exhibit (no. 33) also appears in this volume (30).

An indenture of 1 June 1520 (34) records the provost's undertaking to keep an anniversary in the church of Eton for the soul of a benefactor, George Blackwall. The terms are almost precisely similar to those of an analogous deed of 1528 relating to another benefactor, Thomas Smyth alias Butler, which was described in Eton College Records vol.33 (85).
