Administrative/Biographical history: Messrs. Vaughan and Roche were a firm of solicitors based at Cardiff, Glamorgan, and Newport, Monmothshire, (formerly Downing and Handcock), active in the 19th and 20th centuries. They accumulated papers relating to thier clients' interests, including shipping and industry on South Wales, and the Rawleigh Mansel Dawking and Downing family estates. They also accumulated the records of the Welsh Livery Guild and Llandaff Cathedral Bell Restoration Fund.
