#### INTRODUCTION

Firm founded by Thomas B. Baker in 1845, By 1854 he was also Post Master for Cosham and sold stationery. The shop continued to be both chemists and stationers until it closed in 1973.

Thomas Baker died in 1901 and was succeeded by his nephew Cyril Baker who retired in 1955. The business was then taken over by the Barlow family who had been chemists in Southsea since 1909.
