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HERTFORDSHIRE, County Museum Collection

ACCESSION 103.

This accession is the miscellaneous collection of deeds accumulated by the former County Museum by purchase and gift. The Museum was a joint venture of the County and the boroughs of Hertford and St. Albans and was founded at the end of the last century. It began transferring its documents as soon as the facilities of the County Record Office were available.

The documents however cover much of the county, and single items which fill gaps in other collection's e.g. further fragments of the scattered Ware Park collection (Nos. 38052-7) and many items relate to citizens of London settling in the county.

The deeds, which range in date from the mid sixteenth to the nineteenth century, contain an unusually high percentage (for Hertfordshire) dating from Elizabethan & Jacobean times with much valuable topographical detail.
