Introduction

This collection, which was found in the files of the Hertfordshire Education Department, deals with an abortive attempt to found a senior mixed elementary Church school in Berkhamsted. The proposers were the rector, Rev. William Chipchase Stainsby, and the other managers of the Victoria School, Berkhamsted. They successfully raised most of the money required, won their case in a public enquiry, had plans and trusts approved by the Board of Education, the County Council and the Diocesan Board of Finance, had selected a tender and entered into an agreement with the contractor, when the 1939-45 war put an end of building activities. The school was never built and appears now to have been replaced by the Thomas Bourne School, Durrants Lane.
