Introduction

Until 1885 this circuit was known as the Bishop's Stortford and Hertford circuit and included chapels existing at different dates throughout the whole of East Hertfordshire and West Essex. In 1831 these were Bishop's Stortford, Hertford, Ware, Saffron Walden, Newport, Dane End, Benington, Brickwell, How Green and Braughing. In 1885 the chapels at Bishop's Stortford, Hare Street, Braughing, Berden and Harlow split away to form a separate circuit later known as the North West Essex Mission (see introduction to Bishop's Stortford circuit NM9). From 1902-1912 the churches of the North West Essex Mission were again amalgamated with the Hertford circuit to form the much larger London and Hertford Mission circuit. In 1912 two circuits were again formed and Cheshunt, Waltham Abbey, Ordnance Road (Enfield Lock), Hoddesdon, Hertford, Ware, Wareside, and Watton-at-Stone became the new Waltham Abbey and Hertford circuit. Sewardstone also formed part of this circuit from 1931 until its closure in 1970 and the church at Wareside was closed in 1973.

Today this circuit consists of the churches at Waltham Abbey, Hoddesdon, Cheshunt, Hertford, Ware and Watton-at-Stone.

The circuit forms part of the London North East District of the Methodist church.

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John Wesley preached in Hertford on a number of occasions in the 1770's but not until 1818 was the first chapel erected in Railway Street. The second chapel built in 1840 was on a different site in the same street. A site was acquired in Ware Road, Hertford in 1865 and a chapel opened in 1867. This building was renovated in 1929 but finally demolished in 1962 on the opening of the new church and hall.

Ware Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

There was a Wesleyan Methodist Society in Ware by 1831 as part of the Bishop's Stortford and Hertford circuit (see NM9). A chapel in New Road, Ware was erected in 1839 and enlarged in 1886. It was rebuilt in 1906. This building still exists in ecclesiastical use. The Methodist church, however, has recently amalgamated with the United Reformed Church (formerly Congregational) and now uses their buildings in High Street, Ware known as the Leaside Church.

A Methodist church at Wareside was acquired in 1889 as part of the Hertford Circuit. Numbers attending became very low until in 1964 services were being held only once a month. The church was finally closed in 1965 and sold very shortly afterwards. The trust property at Wareside also included the Ebenezer Temperance Hall built in 1893 by a society of that name. During the Second World War this building and the adjoining cottage began to be let to a series of tenants, the hall being used for light industrial use. These properties were sold in 1973 and the hall itself later converted into a private house. Further papers concerning the sale of the Temperance Hall and cottage can be found in NM10/41.

Cheshunt Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

The house of Samuel Lane in Cheshunt High Street was certified as a place of worship for Methodists in September 1808. By 1854 the society was using Cheshunt Hall in Crossbrook Street (now the Comrades Club). The site at the junction of Cecil Road and the High Road, Cheshunt was acquired in 1896. Opening services of the new church were held in March 1901. Alterations were made to this building in 1931. It was finally closed in 1975 and the site sold. The congregation now share a building with the Anglicans known as Christ Church, Waltham Cross [see also the parish records D/P29B].

BIGGLESWADE METHODIST CIRCUIT

Introduction

The first Biggleswade circuit was formed in 1795. It extended north to St Neots in Huntingdon and south to Stevenage. In 1800 St Neots became the head of this large circuit until in 1810 two circuits were created to be known as the Biggleswade and St Neots circuits. By 1839 these circuits consisted of chapels at the following places:

ST NEOTS: St Neots, Tempsford, Great Barford, Buckden, Bourn, Gamlingay, Eltisley, Toseland, Eaton Socon, Great Staughton, Potton and Great Paxton.

BIGGLESWADE: Biggleswade, Hitchin*, Baldock, Beeston, Weston*, Stevenage*, Langford, Stotfold, Arlesey, Steeple Morden, Ashwell, Newnham, Hinxworth, Norton, Pirton*, Shefford, Walkern*, Ickleford*, Royston, Graveley, Codicote* and Clifton

In 1842 the Hertfordshire churches marked with an asterisk combined to form the Hitchin circuit [see NM4]

On the union of the Methodist churches in 1933 a new Biggleswade circuit was formed to consist of the chapels at Biggleswade [Trinity and Bourne], Beeston, Shefford, High Street Stotfold, Steeple Morden, Langford, Caldecote, Northill, Henlow, Moggerhanger, Meppershall and the Hertfordshire chapels at Baldock, Ashwell and Hinxworth [see NM11B and C].

The chapel at Brook Street Stotfold was transferred to the Letchworth circuit at this date [see NM4S].

In 1970 on the formation of the Hitchin and Letchworth circuit the Biggleswade circuit chapels at Baldock, Ashwell, Hinxworth and High Street Stotfold were transferred to this new circuit [see NM4].

Records of the St Neots and Biggleswade circuits are held at the Bedfordshire Record Office, County Hall, Bedford MK42 9AP.

TRINITY METHODIST CHURCH, BIGGLESWADE (WESLEYAN)

NMllA

A Wesleyan Methodist society was meeting in Biggleswade by 1794. A chapel, financed by Miss Harvey of Hinxworth, was built at Cowfairlands, Biggleswade and opened in 1795. A new site for a chapel was purchased in 1834 and the new building opened in November of the same year. The Cowfairlands chapel was sold and subsequently converted into four cottages. The chapel was renovated in 1889 and additional school and class rooms erected in 1905.

A primitive chapel known as the Bourne, Biggleswade was built in 1874. Until 1933 this chapel formed part of the Hitchin Primitive Methodist circuit (see NM4). It was closed and sold in 1948.

Hinxworth Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

John Wesley preached on many occasions in Hinxworth. Services were held in the home of a Miss Harvey. A site for a chapel was purchased in 1831 for £7 raised by public subscription. This building was demolished in 1863 and a new chapel erected on the same site. The church was closed in 1970 and the premises sold in 1975.

In 1970 this society was transferred from the Biggleswade circuit to the newly formed Hitchin and Letchworth circuit [see NM4].

Ashwell Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

Methodist services were being held in Ashwell at least from 1799. The house of Francis Gentle at Ashwell was certified in February 1824 as a place of worship for Wesleyan Methodists. A church was erected in 1833 and rebuilt in 1880. The last services were held in September 1977 and the building demolished in 1980 for housing development.

In 1970 this society was transferred from the Biggleswade circuit to the newly formed Hitchin and Letchworth circuit [see NM4].

By 1890 there was also a small Primitive Methodist chapel in the village attached to the Hitchin Primitive Methodist Station. It was closed in 1903 [see NM4/2].
