## Leyton Education Committee 1903 - 1965

Records transferred by Leyton Education Department to Leyton Library.

Established by Leyton Urban District Council in 1904 under the provisions of the Education Act 1902, whereby the Council became a 'Part III' authority responsible for elementary education in the Urban Sanitary District. The new Education Committee therefore took control of the four schools in the Cann Hall district established by Wanstead School Board (see L 58.9), in addition to the thirteen schools and pupil teachers centre of the Leyton School Board.

For a brief history of the Education Committee and its schools see <u>Victoria County History of Essex. Vol.VI</u> p.p. 233-239.

Senior Schools and Technical Education became the responsibility of Essex County Council (see L 59). For Leyton U.D.C. Technical Education Committee 1895 - 1903, see L 47.3

The Education Act, 1944, resulted in the disappearance of the Leyton Education Authority, whose schools passed to Essex County Education Authority in April 1945. After representations by the Borough Council to the Minister, a scheme of Divisional Administration was approved in January 1846 and Leyton's schools were re-organised in September 1948 under Leyton Committee for Education.

## Leyton School Camps

The establishment of summer camps for school children was proposed by Leyton Education Committee in 1928 and a Special Sub Committee formed to consider the matter in January 1929. The first camp was held for six weeks at Coopersale, Essex in the Summer of 1929 for children selected by the School Medical Officer. The average number of children attendingwas 80.

After the success of this initial camp, it became an annual event, partly supported by parents contributions. Boys and girls camps met separately, often at Dymchurch Holiday Camp, and logs were apparently compiled retrospectively from notes.
