Records of Leytonstone United Reformed Church, previously Leytonstone Congregational Church, High Road, Leytonstone.

Congregationalism in Leytonstone grew out of meetings held by Tabernacle preachers, followers of George Whitefield, in Leyton from c.1780. Early meetings were held at a house in Chapel Yard in Leyton High Road in conjunction with a group of Methodists as the United Brotherhood of Methodists and Independents which dissolved in 1812. A Congregational Mission was established by students from Hackney College and by 1826 it was felt necessary to erect a small chapel in Leytonstone High Road opposite Back Lane, which was registered in that year by George Collinson, minister of Walthamstow Marsh Street new meeting (1797-1837) also President of the Village Itinerary Society's theological college at Hackney (1803-1847). By 1839 the church, under the name Leytonstone Independent Chapel, was being run by a management committee, though this was to resign the following year because of difficulties arising from the lack of a full-time pastor and responsibility for the Chapel's affairs handed over to Hackney College. The Committee was reconstituted and a pastor appointed in 1844, its business recorded was in a record book for the years 1839-1867.

A temporary iron church was built in the High Road at the corner of Wellesley (now Michael) Road in 1873 to accommodate a growing congregation, but this was found to be inadequate and a permanent church was built near this iron one in 1877. The iron church was used as a Sunday School until 1885 when the Barclay Hall was built to the rear of the new church and the old premises sold. In 1914 an institute was erected on the same site under the Sunday School Forward Movement. The church was damaged by a flying bomb in 1944 and was closed until 1946 and a mission station which had been established by the Congregationalists in 1867 at Harrow Green was sold to Harrow Green Baptist Church in 1943 after that church had been destroyed by enemy action.

Prior to its union with Fillebrook Baptist Church in 1979 (q.v.) Leytonstone Congregational Church had become part of the United Reformed Church.
