Introductory note

As with many of the collections of papers and depoisted material, it has proved impossible to establish exact provenances for the Rectory Manor estate and manor papers. This list is an attempt to bring torether records that were physically scattered, and of which no single list exists to indicate how and when they came into the Museum. It is likely that most of the rolls, registers and papers came through Measure Houshtons, who were the last acting trustees of the Manor. They also appear to have had custody of the Vallentin papers (Sir James Vallentin was the last living Lord of the Kanor), and a msequently these are listed in a second list with the Rectory Konor papers. Further evidence for the origin of the records can be seen in the mator demage sustained by some of the deeds in V 59, and similar demage exhibited by certain Vallentin papers. The earlier court rolls, deposited before 1959, would have escaped this, as this damage is due to 'roding shortly after the Second World Warld War (1947 7).

Besides the material in these lists, there are two other locations of Rectory Eanor material. Firstly the calendar of deeds V 59, form the title deeds of the manor from 1762, when Joseph Fell obtained a private act to lease the manor for 99 years on a building lease, so that one John Matson could build a new manor house (this seems to be the later Rectory Eanor house) to the purchase by Henry Vigne in 1327. This series also includes some later papers, but no title deeds seem to survive between Vigne's purchase and the possession of the manor by Wallentin. For this reason I have kept this series of deeds distinct - my predecessor listed Items MR 1 - 18 and 19 - 31, and at least one item (MH 22) would have appeared have come from the group which is now V 59. This list was on cards only, and has now been superceded by the present list.

Secondly is the item new 7 (0.1, the'Flan of the Ancient Manor of Rectory, Walthamstow Essex ... 1818' drawn up while Theman Wilson Hetherington was Lord of the manor. Items MR 26 - 29 may have been drawn up in conjunction with this map, which is a map of all the manor lands, unlike the plan on V 59.23, which covers only the demense lands and the grounds of the house.

In origin Rectory Manor was founded by a charter of Alice d. Toni, who granted specified lands to the Prior and Canons of Holy Trifity, Aldgate, sometime bet are 1141 and 1147. The grant included scattered lands formerly part of the manor of Walthamatow Toney, together with the church, parsonage, and apps. "The full histor of the manor is described in 'The Rectory Manor, Walthamatow' by G.F.Boswort. (Walthamstow Antiquarian Society Old Series Monograph No 4, 1917), and in 'The Court Rolls of Rectory manor by P.m.Reaney (Walthamstow Antiquarian Society norgraph Old Series ... 37, 1939). At the time of publication of the latter volume only part of the present Rectory Manor holdings had been deposited at vestry House, consequently Reaney's description should be read in conjunction with the current Guide to the Collections and with this catalogue entry. 2

Court rolls 1535 - 1732.

One can only describe the surviving court records an erractic, and the gaps in these court rolls form no exception. Because the manor was created from a larger unit, there appear to be no courts other than general courts or simply 'courts'. These include named members of the homage, but do not specify any officers. Presentments are for encroachments of the waste, but there are no proceedings that one would expect from a usual 16th C court leet, and much of the business of the court is concerned with land transactions, including the coming and going of vicars of St Mary's Church, Walthamstow. For further details of proceedings see heavey opportee.

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Reancy quotest a reference at the end of the court roll of 1686 to 'the parchment covered book to the general proceedings', which he believed to have vanished. This is a fair description of MR 6, externally labelled in a contemporary hand '1606 - 86' but actually covering the years 1677 - 1764. Again the proceedings are court barons. Because of confusion of surviving courts I include here a contents list of the years of courts:

1691, 1701, 1703, 1747 (out of place), 1705, 1706, 1732, 1734, 1737, 1743, 1744, 1753, 1757, 1760, 1761, 1762, 1763, 1764. At back is proceedings of court of 1677.

The earliest is dated 27 August 1627; that of 1705 is from Mr Edwards, bricklayer, that of 1735 by John Jeffries, another of 1735 by Henry Norcott, carpenter, and a bill dated 27 December '69 is from John Conham.
