Camberwell St. Giles Greencoat and National Schools

This school was founded about 1709 as a Charity School and united to the National Society in 1813. In 1870 the old buildings were pulled down and new premises erected in Camberwell Green. The foundation was regulated by a Charity Commissioner's Scheme of 1872. In 1881 a boys' and girls' school in Waterloo Street was amalgamated with the foundation and these premises were afterwards used as an infants' school. In 1958 the School closed and the pupils and funds were transferred to Wilson's Grammar School.

Ely Chapel, Holborn

The lease of the chapel was purchased by Joshua Watson in 1815 and assigned by him to the Society in 1820. The chapel was used by the children and teachers of the Central School at Baldwin's Gardens until the school was transferred to Westminster in 1832. It was then let to the Welsh Metropolitan Church Fund Trustees.

St Martin's in the Fields High School for Girls, Tulse Hill

A Charity School for boys was opened in Hungerford Market in 1699, and a school for girls opened in Castle Street in 1700. In 1783 the school moved to George Street, and in 1796 a new girls' school was opened in Hemings Row. When the site was sold to the National Portrait Gallery in 1868, the governors decided to establish a good secondary school for girls. St Martin's Middle school for Girls was opened in Charing Cross Road in 1875, but by the end of the century the site was proving to be unsuitable for a school. In 1913 a property was purchased in Tulse Hill, and the school moved to its new premises there in 1928. Except for a period during the Second World War when the school was evacuated to St John's Leatherhead, it has remained at Tulse Hill.

The surviving records reflect this varied history and relate to both the boys and girls charity (parochial) schools until the 19th Century, and from 1873 onwards to the High School for Girls only.
