Board Of Guardians Records (G/Lei)

The union came into being on 26th January 1837; it comprised of an area covering the whole of the ancient parish of Leigh and part of that of Winwick, an acreage of 18,830 and a population of over 25,000 people. There were workhouses in existence in Pennington, Culcheth, Tyldesley and Lowton, but these were replaced by a central workhouse at Ather-Leigh, built in the 1850's.
