He claimed that "labourers were employed in this new undertaking on the road the following morning, opposite the place called Pomfret's Avenue in Towcester".

Northampton Public Library Documents

On the next page is a note about this catalogue compiled in November 1982. In the first paragraph it is remarked that there then still remained some legal papers and deeds to be catalogued. This has now been done, the documents being numbered NPL 2339-2920. Their descriptions or catalogue entries follow below.

In addition to the remarks made on the next page it should be mentioned that there are a few documents, mainly in volume form, which may have once formed part of identifiable groups in these collections and which have been retained at the Library.

It is hoped to provide a typed version of the indexes in due course.

#### NORTHAMPTONSHIRE RECORD OFFICE

### Northampton Public Library Documents

- These documents were deposited in the Record Office on various occasions the bulk in 1960. In November 1982 there still remain some 18th & 19th century legal papers and deeds to be catalogued (parts of Acc. 1960/76 and 1962/51).
- An index to persons, places (including parishes and streets in Northampton) and subjects exists on cards in the Record Office Index Room.
- The collection was acquired by the Public Library at various times sometimes in small bundles from dealers and sometimes from local firms of solicitors. It would be difficult to determine the provenance of each document.
- Other documents that have been deposited by the Public Library include what appear to be more homogeneous groups which have been catalogued separately as the Hanbury (Kelmarsh) collection (Acc. 1960/76 H(K) 1-304; Acc. 1964/21 H(K) 305-355). The Harvey Thursby (Abington) collection (Acc. 1960/76 HT(A) 1-375; Acc. 1964/21 HT(A) 376-432) and the Hensman (Northampton) collection (Acc. 1960/76 listed chronologically).

Some of the documents in the main collection are evidently strays from these separate groups.
