1-3. 1856 - 1857

Letters from George Rushby, proprietor of Farn Hill School, nr. Chester, to John Jones and his father, Capt. John Jones re John's school progress:

1. 1856 Dec. 23

LETTER: George Rushby, Farn Hill School, nr. Chester, to John Jones, acknowledging his letter and is glad to hear that his mother was pleased with his books. They will have many new boarders there next term. Mrs. Rushby and others there send him their love.

Appended:

RECEIPT: George Rushby to Capt. Jones of Portmadoc, for the sum of £3.16s.6d. being balance of account for son John's board, education, books, etc. as per account rendered.

2. 1857 Feb. 17

LETTER: G. Rushby, Proprietor of Farn Hill School, nr. Chester to Capt. J. Jones, Schooner Wm. Alexander, Portmadoc, re his son's school progress which will 'cause him some day to shine either at sea or on shore' and gives details of subjects undertaken by him.

3. 1857 June 16

LETTER: George Rushby to Capt. Jones sending his accounts which he hopes Capt. Jones will find correct. Should his son's improvement be as satisfactory to Capt. Jones as it is to him, he asks him to recommend his establishment to his friends.

4-11. 1856 - 1859

Letters written by John Jones to his parents
from Farn Hill School, nr. Chester:

4. 1856 Aug. 2

LETTER: John Jones, Farn Hill School, nr. Chester, to his mother, acknowledging her letter. He is getting on very well with his studies. They have only 17 boarders there now, but are expecting more. Sends his regards to the family and asks her to let him know about William.

5. 1856 Aug. 26

LETTER: John Jones to his mother, from Farn Hill School, nr. Chester, acknowledging his sister's letter. He is happy to hear that his father had arrived safely at Newcastle and is chartered for Waterford. He is sorry to hear that Mr. Spooner of Morfa Lodge is dead. He will have to buy a compass box as Mr. Rushby has told him that he must learn algebra and geometry. Sends regards to his old schoolmaster, Mr. Robert Parry, friends and relatives. Asks her to send him a newspaper occasionally.

6. 1856 Sept. 19

LETTER: John Jones to his mother, from Farn Hill School, nr. Chester, acknowledging her letter and is glad to know that his father had arrived safely at Waterford. He had been expecting a letter from his father in answer to the one he wrote to him but expects he is home by now. One of his fellow-pupils from Pwllheli, went home a fortnight ago to his mother's funeral. Sends his love to all the family.

7. 1857 June 6

LETTER: John Jones to his mother, from Farn Hill School, nr. Chester, informing her of his pleasure in obeying Mr. Rushby's request of their departure from school. He thanks her for her kindness in allowing him the privileges he has enjoyed and is determined to prove to her that she has not spent so much money in vain. Asks her for some pocket money to cover his expenses home.

8. 1857 July 23 LETTER: John to his mother, from Farn Hill School, nr. Chester (proprietor: G. Rushby), informing her of his arrival at Farn Hill where he was welcomed by Mr. and Mrs. Rushby. Asks if his father had sailed from Portmadoc. He looks forward to going with his father and shall make all the progress he can to prepare himself for the business. Sends his love to friends and relatives. Asks for stamped envelopes.
9. 1857 Aug. 22 LETTER: John Jones, Farn Hill School, nr. Chester, to his mother. He is expecting a letter from home telling him of his father's arrival at Memel. Asks for newspaper giving details of the Criccieth Regatta and hopes the Daniel has not been beaten this time. They have seven Welsh boys at the school now, one of them being the son of Robert Wynne, Cyfneymera, Llanbedr, nr. Harlech. Sends his regards to all the family. He looks forward to Wm. Roberts, Pensyflog coming to the school next quarter.
10. 1857 Oct. 29 LETTER: John Jones, Farn Hill School, nr. Chester, to his parents, informing them of his arrival after a pleasant journey, when he had the company of the Rev. Wm. Rees of Liverpool, all the way from Portmadoc to Chester. Mr. & Mrs. Rushby, Mrs. Roberts, Mrs. Bridson and all his fellow pupils had been glad to see him. He would like to hear how his father settled with the club about the damage done to the William Alexander. Asks for a copy of the Gazette with particulars of the fall of Dehli.
11. 1859 Sept. 21 LETTER: John Jones, Farn Hill School, nr. Chester, to his mother, acknowledging the paper she had sent him and is glad to see that his father has sailed for Liverpool as he hopes he will be allowed to go and see him. Asks her to write to Mr. Rushby for his permission. Asks for pocket money.

12-16. 1857 - 1858

Letters from Capt. John Jones of the schooner
Wm. Alexander to Margaret, his wife:

12. 1857 May 16

LETTER: John Jones from Dantzic [Danzig] to his wife Margaret. They have loaded and are ready for sea.

If he was longer on the voyage, it would pay, as the freight is up about 1s. 11d. a quarter. He thinks the Eagle is fixed for the Bristol Channel at 5s. 6d. a quarter. The merchant gave them too much barley and as barley is 15% less than wheat, they will make about £120 freight. He has only received two letters there from his wife. She will see from the list what time they actually sail from there. If he goes ashore at Elsinmore, he will write. He sends her a bill of £80.

13. 1858 March 26

LETTER: John Jones from Falmouth to his wife, Margaret, informing her of their arrival there. The Ann Jones had also docked there the previous night. John and himself are in good health.

14. 1858 April 5

LETTER: John Jones from Hamburg, to his wife, Margaret informing her of their arrival there after a long passage. Thos. Richards arrived there 3 days before them. He writes of the loss of the Jennet [Lewis Griffith, Captain] ran down by a steamer. The Elizabeth, O. Lloyd, Ann Jones, E. Williams and the Ester arrived there the previous night. Their son John would be writing to her the following day.

15. 1858 Aug. 3

LETTER: John Jones to Margaret, his wife, from Dantzic [Danzig] acknowledging her two letters and is glad to know that she is getting better. He had fixed to load slippers for Holyhead at 17/- a load, the best he could do and time taken to load and discharge would be 18 days. Asks her to tell Capt. Jones, late of the Celerity, that the Gazelle is also fixed for Holyhead with the same merchandise. Capt. Davies was surprised that no one had informed him of his father-in-law's death, when John Jones told him. Sends his regards to friends and relatives.

16.

1858

Aug. 14

LETTER: J. Jones from Dantzic [Danzig] to Margaret, his wife, acknowledging her 2 letters. They have finished loading after 14 days and are down at Fairwater, ready to sail in the morning if the wind is right. He does not expect the freight to make more than 285 as times are bad, there. The Gazelle is alongside them ready for sea and bound for Holyhead. He asks her to send 25 to E. Davies, wife of John Davies, 'Tu-gwun' as he borrowed this sum from him there. The voyage has been bad and he hopes the passage will be quick.

Appended:

LETTER: John, son of John Jones to his mother. He has been feeling unwell but the doctor said it was nothing of any consequence. Asks her to enquire what price Owen Owens or Thomas Parry would give for a fathom of lathwood of 4ft. long and asks her to let him know at Holyhead.

17-21. 1858

Letters from John Jones to his mother, Mrs.
Margaret Jones:

17. 1858 April 8

LETTER: John Jones to his mother from Hamburg, informing her of their arrival there after a long passage. Informs her of the loss of the Jennette off Cuxhaven, the crew of which was up there and they had contributed a crown each to this crew. His father had put his offer for the east coast of Ireland, the Eagle Jones had chartered for the same, but he thinks the freight is very low at 1s. 10½d. per quarter.

The Integrity, the Confidence 2, the Elizabeth and the Ann Jones were also there. Sends his regards to friends and relatives.

18. 1858 April 18

LETTER: John Jones to his mother from Hamburg acknowledging his sister's letter, but did not receive the Gazette Laura had sent him. They will finish loading the next day and will be ready then to sail for Dublin. The Eagle and the Annie had sailed the previous Thursday and the Confidence and the Integrity have chartered for the east coast of Ireland. The Alice arrived there the previous day.

Appended:

LETTER: John Jones to his wife, Margaret, enclosing a bill of £55.0s.0d. and suggests she meets John and him at Dublin.

19. 1858 July 2

LETTER: John from Downs to his mother, where they had arrived that morning after a passage of fine weather and gives details of the voyage. Includes a statement of account - J. Jones, with a/c of the owners of the William Alexander from 7th Dec. 1857 to 30th June 1858.

20. 1858 July 25

LETTER: John from Dantzic [Danzig], to his mother, informing her of his arrival after a fine passage from Copenhagen. Would have written sooner but Capt. Roberts of the Owen, mentioned in his letter of their arrival. The Gazelle arrived there on the same day. Times are bad there, his father has not been offered anything in the grain trade. They have only received one letter from home, whereas they have sent four. He hopes his mother received the bill of £75 which his father sent home 14 days before. The Owen sailed for Southampton the previous day. They will write as soon as his father gets something which he hopes will be soon. Sends his love to friends and relations.

21. 1858 Aug. 29

LETTER: John Jones, Dungeness Road, to his mother, informing her of their arrival after a tedious passage. Gives details of the passage. Both his father and himself are expecting to see her at Holyhead. They had met the Rose coming round the South. Forelane, the John Williams and the Endeavour were at anchor in the Downs.

22-28. 1850 - 1928

Miscellaneous letters:

22. 1850 June 13

LETTER: William Jones, Ysgubor Hen, to Mr. William Morris, Harbour Master, Portmadoc, re his meeting William Jones and his brother-in-law at Pwllheli to sign a bill of hand and asks him to bring the deed as security.

23. 1872 Jan. 3

LETTER: Margaret Jones, 12 Lombard Street, Portmadoc to ?. sending the Society a signed receipt and a cheque for 11s.3d. which will increase the share to a quarter more. to re invest in the Society.

24. 1873 April 23

LETTER: W. Jones Morris, R.M.S. Abyssinia off Queenstown to his parents, Mr. & Mrs. W.E. Morris, 24 Lombard St., Portmadoc, re his voyage. They have nice passengers and one officer used to be Captain of the City of St. Asaph when Isabell Ridley took over.

25. 1882 Nov. 6

LETTER: M. Jones, Brewer's Hotel, Queen's Square, Bristol to his sister, Mrs. Margaret Jones, 12 Lombard St., Portmadoc, acknowledging letter with enclosure from Laura Morris. He had been very miserable on the Sunday, being his first day from home. In the afternoon he had gone to the Cathedral and in the evening to the Welsh Congregational Chapel where the attendance was under 30, and had heard a very indifferent sermon by a young Newquay man, an assistant chemist in the city there. He is going to Newport that afternoon. The ship is not yet chartered as there is a change of captains. He had sent her the Cambrian News. He had received a letter from Capt. Richards that morning. He hopes she has fine weather for her meeting the next day.

26. 1883 June 23

LETTER: L. M & M. Jones, Llandrindod, niece and brother, to Aunt and sister; re a visit they are enjoying which has proved beneficial to their health. They are returning home next Tuesday. They have met a few people from the North - Mrs. Rees Jones, Portdinorwic a Mrs. Hughes, connected with the family of Hughes, Tregof, and a brother of the late Sir Hugh Cwen.

27. 1885 July 15

LETTER: L. Morris, Rhydlyadu, Llandrindod to her aunt. She is enjoying her holidays and will be home sometime that month.

28. 1928 Dec. 18

LETTER: Emrys from the firm of George Heywood Son & Hughes, 23 Queen St., Oldham to Lena. He is sending her, under separate cover, a copy of the Hughes' genealogical tree. It's not quite complete, because two more generations could be put on which would take the Hughes' ancestors back to about 1600. He is tolerably certain of the facts but he would like to confirm them from the parish registers before putting them on the table. Richard Hughes was the son of Hugh Prichard of Abererch and Llannor and has some connection with Penysban. Some day he was going to root it all out. Writes about a meeting at Twickenham. Wishes them all a Merry Xmas.

29-33. 1858 - 1860

CERTIFICATE OF CHARACTER AND DISCHARGE of John Jones of Caernarvonshire, aged 15, engaged on the ship Wm. Alexander, on a voyage to Dantzic [Danzig], 8 Aug. 1859 to 5 Dec. 1859. Character for ability and conduct good. Signed by John Jones, master of the ship and Thos. Morris, Shipping Master.

33. 1860 June 26

CERTIFICATE OF CHARACTER AND DISCHARGE of John Jones of Portmadoc, aged 16, engaged as ordinary seaman on the ship Wm. Alexander, on a voyage to the Baltic, March 1860 to 26 June 1860. Character for ability and conduct very good. Signed by John Jones, master of the ship and R.G. Cheesman Shipping Master.
