If the said executors shall be interrupted in their term, Thomas Breynton' shall deliver to them two obligations, each of them of ten pounds, in which the said Richard Moreley, Simond Blake, and others, are bound to the late bishop and to the said executors. If the said Richard discharges his debt, then these deeds are to be returned to him.

(i) Lease dated the Saturday next before the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, 1398, whereby Richard Kingeston, canon of the cathedral church of Hereford and custos of the Almeshowse of Hereford leased to Thomas Nutt all those lands, etc., in Buckenhill in the manor of Wolhope for sixty years at a rent of four shillings.
