

- M 5590 A.L.S. from Ada, Countess of Lovelace, to C.Babbage arranging his visit to her and referring to De Morgan's praise of her article on mathematics (c.1842)
- M 352/38 A.L.S. from William Buckland to T.Bailey concerning the gravel of Nottingham and its neighbourhood. N.d.

I am not certain whether you are concerned with the manuscripts of men who were of local importance but not nationally known. The following are the only MSS. in the Archives Department of the City Libraries concerning persons mentioned on your list. They are all contained in M 352, an album of autographs and letters addressed to or collected by Philip James Bailey (author of 'Festus').

- Letter from Sir Edward James Reed to an unnamed addressee ("Dear Sir"). Admiralty, 14th May (no year). "...I shall be delighted to see Mr. Bailey on Monday evening..."; and suggesting alternative date, etc. 4 pp.
- Letter from Lord Dufferin to E.J. Reed, 8 Grosvenor Square,
 23 Dec., 1869. "...I have sent my Post Admiral to inspect the Providence - I am afraid however she is rather small as I want room for a lady...". 1 p.
- 3. Letter from Joseph Whitworth to E.J. Reed, The Firs, nr. Manchester. Feb. 20th/60. "...I regret your inability to be present at own experiment next Wednesday and Thursday, as it would I think have given you pleasure to see the working of the guns..."; and offering to send a drawing and information. 2 pp.
