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Introduction

The Church of England Men's Society was formed in 1899 by the amalgamation of three district Church Societies for Men. In 1900 its constitution was formulated. Its Rule of Life stated that members should pray to God every day and do something to help forward the work of the Church. Its objects were to deepen the spiritual life of its members, band churchmen together to promote the glory of God and promote opportunities for friendly intercourse among members.

In 1905 the Rochester and District Federation of the C.E.M.S. was founded consisting of branches in this area, each sending between two and four delegates to meetings and paying an annual affiliation fee. The Federation's task was to promote new branches, inform incumbents of the C.E.M.S., arrange united meetings of branches and encourage visits between branches in order to spread knowledge of the Church of England and foster unity. It also was to help foster co-operation between the Clergy and Laity.

The Rochester Diocesan Union Council was founded in 1908 to unite the Federations and branches within the diocese and connect with the rest of the country and the world. The Council also organised an Annual Conference. The C.E.M.S. was finally dissolved in 1985.
