INTRODUCTION

Origins

Strood Rural District Council was brought into being in 1895 by the Local Government Act 1894. The same Act also created Parish Councils, the lowest or third tier of Local Government as subsequently defined. Records of most of the Parish Councils in the former Strood and Hoo Rural District Council areas are also held by this Centre (please ask staff). Strood RDC was formed largely out of the area administered by Rochester Highway Board itself based substantially on an area coinciding with the Earl of Darnley's estates (see U.565).

Created alongside the original Strood Rural District Council in 1895 was Hoo Rural District Council, whose offices were located at Hoo St. Werburgh and which administered the parishes of the eastern portion of the Hoo Peninsula (for whose records please see HRDC and whose parishes are listed below).

Both Rural District Councils were amalgamated under the provisions of the Kent Review Order of 1935 on 1st April 1936.

B. Matthews in his "A History of Strood Rural District" 1971 states that Strood Rural District Council held its inaugural meeting on 3rd January 1895 (p.74) although the last Minute Book of Rochester Highway Board (HB/RO/1B p.396) seems to record the first meeting of a Strood Rural District Council on 9th April 1895.

Not all of Rochester Highway Board's area passed to Strood Rural District Council (see below). The first separate Strood Rural District Council Minute Book begins in 1897 (SRDC/1)

Administrative Background

Under the terms of the Local Government Act 1894, Strood Rural District Council was to inherit the "powers duties and liabilities" of Strood Board of Guardians as Rural Sanitary Authority (for whose records see G/HO) and likewise (theoretically) those of Rochester Highway Board (see above) as Highway Authority, that is to say to assume statutory powers in connection with public health and highways. There is a single item in this collection directly taken over from Rochester Highway Board, a Committee report book from 1883 (589).

While Rochester Highway Board stood down altogether in 1896, the Strood Board of Guardians continued to provide poor relief until 1930 and to levy rates to finance such until 1925.

It should be noted that the adjacent Hoo Rural District Council inherited the functions of Hoo Highway Board as Highway Authority (at the time of writing (1993) these records have not been located) and of Hoo Board of Guardians (see G/HO) as Rural Sanitary Authority. Similarly, Hoo Board of Guardians continued to provide poor relief until 1930 and to levy rates to this end until 1925.

In practice Kent County Council had assumed control of main roads in 1888 and minor roads in 1894.

In general, the new District Council inherited some of the ancient civil functions of the ecclesiastical parishes, whose records for the Rochester Archdeaconry area are also kept at this Centre (please ask for the parish lists).

Finally, regarding the seat of council business, the Strood Rural District Council Offices were located originally at the Medway Board of Guardians Board Room (still standing) in Gun Lane, Strood. From 12th October 1934 the Council met at Frindsbury Hill (also still standing).

It should be noted at the earliest opportunity that Strood Rural District Council did <u>not</u> administer the town of Strood or Frindsbury Intra. Strood itself was part of the City of Rochester, although <u>initially</u> Strood Rural District Council did include Strood Extra, and a greater part of Frindsbury Extra than it held subsequently. As it was, Strood Rural District Council only just managed to keep

its offices at Frindsbury Hill within its own district, by mutual agreement with Rochester City Council following boundary negotiations.

Records of the City of Rochester, Frindsbury Extra Parish Council and Strood Extra Parish Meeting are kept at this Centre. For information on their Local Authority boundaries please see Local Authorities maps and plans (MP/B), Ordnance Survey maps, Parish Council and Church of England parish records (at this Centre).

Strood Rural District Council stood down in 1974, its former area divided between Gravesham Borough (Cobham, Higham, Luddesdown and Meopham and Shorne) and Medway District Council (the remainder). Rochester Upon Medway City Council is the present name of the former Medway District Council.

The Parishes in the District

These were Allhallows, Cliffe, Cobham, (including Nursted from 1935), Cooling, Cuxton, Frindsbury Extra, Grain, Halling, Higham, High Halstow, Hoo St. Mary, Hoo St. Werburgh, Luddesdown, Meopham, Shorne and Stoke. However, these parishes in total were only in the Strood Rural District between 1935 and 1974: the parishes of Allhallows, Cooling, Grain, High Halstow, Hoo St. Mary, Hoo St. Werburgh and Stoke had lain within Hoo Rural District from 1896-1935 (see above, origins section).

Order by Minister of Health 1934

By mutual agreement with the City of Rochester, parts of Strood Extra and Frindsbury Extra were transferred to that Authority with effect from 1st April 1934.

Kent Review Order 1935

Gravesend Corporation succeeded in acquiring Chalk and Denton against Strood Rural District Council's wishes together with parts of Ifield and Cobham while for its part Strood Rural District Council gained Nursted, to form part of Cobham, these arrangements taking effect from 1st April 1935. (See Printed Minutes 1935-1939 /10).

Some General Historical aspects of Strood Rural District Council and the Collection

The Character of Strood Rural District is described well by Brian Matthews in "A History of Strood Rural District" 1971.

However, it should be emphasised that Strood Rural District developed a very strong identity and fought the hardest out of the Medway area authorities to survive the 1972 Local Government legislation, although most of its former area still constitutes the bulk of the present Rochester Upon Medway District as constituted in 1974 (see above, administrative background).

The period 1897-1974 saw major population and industrial growth, housing development, significant provision of leisure facilities and increased wealth for the Authority, which as early as 1934 could build its new Council offices at Frindsbury Hill entirely out of its own revenue, then a highly unusual achievement for a Local Authority (Minutes /10 p.201).

Many of the historical and contemporary associations of the district mentioned in Matthews' book are echoed in the records, which will be useful to family, social, economic and military historians and many others.

The frequent occurrence in the records of the Solicitors Arnold, Tuff and Grimwade, of the Precinct, Rochester, Solicitors, is due to their acting as Solicitors for Strood RDC. The firm is now Martin Tolhurst Partnership (1994).

In general, researchers should bear in mind the usefulness of the Council Minutes 1897-1974 for answers to most queries.

Social and Leisure History

Of particular importance under this heading is the massive investment made by the area in Council and private housing. The district began in 1897 with a rural population largely limited to agricultural pursuits but by 1974 Strood Rural District Council was at the very least equal to the City of Rochester as an industrial base with associated population growth, mainly affecting Grain and Hoo St. Werburgh, but also the Chalk area at an early stage, while the parts of the district adjacent to the City of Rochester were continually giving way to that Authority's need for territorial expansion for housing. (See also the "Wartime" section below).

Reference should be made to the Clerks Department: housing section 1933-1974, Engineer and Surveyor's Department: housing section 1933-1974 and Local Government Reorganisation section 1932-1974, and Treasurer's Department, rating section 1897-1874. Printed sources such as street directories will also supplement these sources (available in the Centre's searchroom).

Strood Rural District developed in places as a commuter area, mainly centred on Meopham, and also as a place for Londoners' weekend homes. The Clerk's Department Town and Country Planning section contains records relevant to this subject. Associated with commuting is the subject of transport. In particular railways impinged on the district because of the nearness of London, the new industries of the Hoo Peninsula, the Allhallows Holiday Estate and Defence establishments and are well covered in the Clerk's Department: industry and transport section. London's third airport (see items 439-440) railway cutbacks and closures and various narrow gauge railways are specific issues discussed. For railways especially, see items /433-438.

The perennial Gypsy problem affected Strood Rural District Council as it did all other Local Authorities and is well covered in the Clerk's Department, Public Health section 1955-1965. Of general social historical interest are items /221-224, 235, 360-361, 363-366, /245 and /755-778.

Strood Rural District Council's involvement in leisure provision is illustrated by the Clerk's Department; Leisure section (1933-1974) a large part of which deals with the development and administration of Allhallows Holiday Estate (1958-1973).

Deangate Ridge Golf Course is also well charted for the period 1941-1974, for which see the Clerk's Department: Leisure section, together with items /876 and 878.

Worthy of mention as of social and public health interest are the records of the joint Strood Rural District Council/Gravesend Corporation Insolation Hospital for which see Clerk's Department: Public Health section, provision of services sub-section (1903-1967) but see also items /229-231.

Family History

Potentially all the material in the collection is of genealogical value due to the frequent mention of the names and addresses of local inhabitants of the district, whether as correspondents or as the subject of Council business. So for example, Housing and Civil Defence files contain many mentions of inhabitants.

However, certain records are of more value, such as the rate books 1938-1974 (see Treasurer's Department), Council staff records 1935-1969 (Clerk's Department) and the Old Age Pensions and National Savings records 1908-1966, in particular the register of claims for Army and Navy separation allowances 1914-1917 listing possibly most servicemen in the district (/777) (Treasurer's Department). Item (237) also lists names, service numbers and units of personnel treated at the Isolation Hospital in 1940.

The Rural District in Wartime

The researcher should refer to the Clerk, Treasurer and Engineer and Surveyor's Departments' Civil Defence records 1937-1972, together with housing requisitioning records from 1939 onwards (among the Clerk and Treasurer's records).

There are many mentions of surviving samples of wartime military architecture and activities and the following are examples.

Military: See items /78-80, 92, 110, 778 and 783.

Prisoners of War: /263.

Prefabricated and temporary houses: /273-274, 316, 349-350, 354, 355, 417, 474, 480-481.

One final point should be made appropriately under this Wartime heading, in connection with the Civil Defence records contained in the collection. Chatham and its environs, prior to 1984, were the only atomic bomb target in Kent and therefore C.D. records among neighbouring Authorities like Strood Rural District Council may assume an added significance.

The Environment

The collection contains a useful record of Council business in connection with flood prevention and anti-pollution schemes. For flooding see especially items /491-493, 495 867-871. (Items 492-493, 495 relate to serious natural disasters which affected the locality in 1953 and 1968). For pollution, see especially items /872 and /497-499.

Council staff and Members

The collection is unusual in the significant quantity and variety of records which throw light on individuals serving on or employed by Strood Rural District Council. The material includes photographs of Strood Rural District Council staff and activities c.1970 (See /90-91), files on the Isolation Hospital and its staff 1932-1948 (/236-242), and newscutting books 1939-1974 (84-89). Item (/322) contains useful information on A.E. Stroud, a longstanding Clerk.

In general, please see also the Clerk's staff section 1916-1974 (/92-98) for further details together with the Full Council/Members' matters section 1931, 1960 (/72-73).

Arrangement of the Collection

The collection has been arranged by department and within department by the various named statutory functions of the Authority. In practice there is much overlap in subject matter between departments and even named functions within departments due to the variety of business covered by individual Acts of Parliament and the executive responsibilities of the Chief Officers concerned.

Therefore it is strongly recommended that reference be made from e.g. the Civil Defence section of the Clerk's records to the Civil Defence section of the Engineer and Surveryor's records, likewise e.g. from the Public Health and Welfare section to the Housing section each among the Clerk's records (please see contents pages, also arranged by department).

Additionally, individual descriptive entries and section or sub-section headings provide cross references to aid in locating similar material listed elsewhere in the collection.

Many Acts of Parliament, but not all, under the terms of which Local Authority business was carried out, are listed at section and sub-section headings. Printed statutes are held locally at Chatham Central Library.

While the collection comprises only material which has been selected for permanent preservation, it should be noted that many other Strood Rural District Council records may have been destroyed prior to 1987 when Rochester Upon Medway City Council established the City Archives. Also, it should be borne in mind that other surviving Strood Rural District Council material can be found elsewhere (see section following).

Photograph /91/8 is interesting in showing the record room of the Engineer and Surveyor's Department, where presumably many of that department's records were kept, if not other departments' as well.

Underlining in Descriptive Entry Headings

Underlined headings are supplied by the City Archivist to enlarge on the original headings (which are quoted in full with original file number but not underlined) as the latter are not fully descriptive of the record contents or where no original title exists. The records treated in this way are nearly always files.
