A. Acknowledgements.

I would like to thank Vera, Lady Dawe, for drawing my attention to the existence of these records and to Mr. William S. Rice, the General Secretary of the National Association, for permitting me to list them and for all the help he and Mrs. Leonora Pitcairn (formerly head of the Association's Education Department) gave me.

The survey was made in the light of the research and archive acquisition interests of the University of Liverpool (which has declared its interests in acquiring the archives of national bodies relating to children for which no existing repository provides a natural home, which are at risk and which have a relevance to research in the University) and my own interests in the sources for the social history of medicine.

B. Notes on procedure and classes of record not found.

- 1. Mr. Rice informed me that the Association's Library was disposed of some years ago whilst the Association was housed in B.M.A. House, Tavistock Square, London. Whilst he was not then on the staff he suggested Miss Betteridge, as a long-serving member of staff, might be able to indicate the nature of the library's stock and whether any of it was given to other libraries.
- The National Association does not have local branches. Local health authorities etc. are affiliated to the Association and are represented on its Council.
- 3. The National Association is registered as a charity and so presumably some of the gaps in the series of annual reports etc. may be filled by the holdings of the Charity Commission (Central Register of Charities, St.Albans House, 57/60 Haymarket, London, SW1Y 4QX).
- 4. Inasmuch as my visit occupied only three hours there was no time to enquire of the Education Department regarding retained copies of other publications, etc., but it is believed that few such publications etc. of any age survive other than those here listed.
- 5. The National Association occupies several rooms on the second floor of 1, South Audley Street, which is in Mayfair, other occupants of the building including the National Association for Gifted Children.

The following entry appears in Sir Nikolaus Pevsner's The Buildings of England: London I The Cities of London and Westminster, Penguin Books, 1957, p.575:-

"[South Audley Street].. Nos. 2 and 1, red brick with very gay Renaissance detail c.1878-9. By Frederick P. Cockerell [1833-78], completed by [George] Aitchison"

Mr. Rice informed me that the house was, for a time, the London home of Sir John Reeves Ellerman, the exceptionally wealthy shipping magnate, and that the charitable trust he established, the New Moorgate Trust, are the owners of the building, leasing accommodation in it to such charitable bodies as the National

Association. For Sir John Ellerman (1862-1933) see The Dictionary of National Biography 1931-1940, 1949, pp. 255-257, which refers to "the great Victorian mansion at 1 South Audley Street. his house overflowed with mosaics, tapestries, carvings, furniture, and a medley of objects, some of them works of art and others without value.." Even nowadays some of the panelling etc. surviving in 1 South Audley Street contributes to the unique, attractive character of the building.

C. Brief note on the history of the Association.

There is no published history of the National Association although Mrs. Leonora Pitcairn tells me she hopes to write a portrait of the association's work over the years based on the surviving records, recollections, etc.

As an analysis of the titles of the various listed annual reports etc., reveals, the National Association was formed out of an amalgamation, in c. 1938, of the National Association for the Prevention of Infant Mortality (NAPIM) and the Association of Maternity and Child Welfare Centres (AMCWC). The amalgamated body was initially entitled the National Association of Maternity and Child Welfare Centres and for the Prevention of Infant Mortality, by 1948 becoming the National Association for Maternity and Child Welfare and by 1958 the National Association for Maternal and Child Welfare, its current title.

Of the two original branches, the NAPIM traced its origins back to 1906 (see Minutes listed on p.15) and became part of what became known as the National League for Health, Maternity and Child Welfare (itself incorporated in 1905). For the Annual Reports of this National League see the list pp. 6-9.

The other branch, the AMCWC, was founded in 1911 under the name of The Association of Infant Welfare and Maternity Centres, and was entitled the Association of Maternity and Child Welfare Centres by 1930 (see the list $p.\ 9$).

For over twenty five years the National Association had its offices at B.M.A. House, Tavistock Square, W.C.1, moving to 1, South Audley Street, W.1 on 9 Dec. 1976. Prior to this period the NAPIMWI is found occupying offices at 4 Tavistock Square by 1914, the National League for Health, Maternity and Child Welfare also being based at 4 and 5 Tavistock Square by 1919 and until c.1920.

Nowadays the work of the National Association is thriving. Under the patronage of H.M. The Queen, the Association has and still holds prestigious and influential national conferences annually, the venue being in various centres in Britain (e.g. in Southport in 1962 and in Edinburgh in 1965). The work of the Association's Education Department is particularly significant in its influence on present and future generations.

The "rival" association to the National Association, the National Baby Welfare Council (which was formed in the early 20th century), was finally dissolved in 1963. Linked with the local authority health departments and with DHSS (as indeed is nowadays the National Association), the Council's organ was the monthly journal, Mother and Child, which finally ceased publication in 1974; apparently the British Museum (Library) and the Bodleian Library were sent copies of the journal. Various records of the Council are deposited with the Librarian, the Royal Free Hospital School of Medicine, 8 Hunter Street, London, W.C.1.
