- 6. The Minute Books incorporate Prospectus, Balance Sheet, Debenture, Guarantees, Notes on the duties of the Superintendent and Collector, Form of application for Dwellings, Directors' Reports (second report, 1886 and following reports).
- 7. Original capital of £40,000 in 1,600 shares of £25 each, of which £5 payable on application, £5 on allotment, and the remainder by such calls as the directors think fair.

Capital raised in 1891 to £80,000 and in 1897 to £200,000 (subsequent increases were made).

8. The Notices in the book referred to in No. 3 above included Notices to Tenants (some in English and Yiddish), advertisements, notices of meetings, dividend warrants, share certificates, notices about Baths, rent books, and various other similar matter, going up to 1937. There are also notices relating to the Club at Stepney Green Dwellings. These are partly bound into the book, and partly lying loose between the sheets.
