Rear Rand manders,

Thank you for your letter of 7th November. I can confirm that the following will be retained at Villiers Park for historic reasons:

 A full set of the Eton Manor Club's monthly magazine "Chin-Wag" bound in annual volumes commencing March 1913 and finishing in October 1966 (Vol. LII).

[It was in 1913 that Lord Roberts opened the Club, money having been raised since 1907.]

2) Minute Books of the Boys' Club: Vol. III - 31 October 1911 to September 1915 Vol. V - March 1918 to May 1922 Vol. VI - May 1922 to September 1926 Vol. VII - September 1926 to September 1931 Vol. VIII - September 1931 to May 1940 Vol. IX - May 1940 to April 1951

Vols. I & II and later volumes, presumably two, are sadly missing, the latter two having mysteriously disappeared from our shelves here.

[As Vol. III begins in 1911, the minutes obviously go back to when the Boys' Club of Eton Mission was housed in an old shop known as "The Backyard Club" either then or later. This was in a street running at right angles to Daintry Street on the corner of which Eton Old Boys' Club was running prior to 1913 and, of interest to you is that we have an oil painting of this Club on our premises dated 1909.]

- 3) A single volume titled: "Chin-Wag being the War record of the Eton Manor Club from 1914 - 1918"
- 4) A typed volume of The Eton Manor War Memorial 1939 to 1946 - A Tribute researched by Mike Reynolds
